

- 1. All entries to reach the Secretary no later than Tuesday 11th July. No late entries will be accepted **EXCEPT** for Horse & Dog Classes, unless at the Secretary's discretion.
- 2. Tents will be open to receive exhibits from 8.30am. to 10.30 am. after which they will be closed except for the judges and persons responsible for the arrangements. In exceptional circumstances exhibits can be received on the Friday evening.
- 3. No exhibit to be removed before 4.15 p.m. Tents to be cleared by 4.45 p.m.
- 4. Prize money must be claimed between 4.15 pm. & 4.45pm on presentation of Winners' tickets at the Horticultural Marquee.
- 5. Cups to be returned to Secretary 14 DAYS before next show
- Competitors may enter more than one exhibit in any class. All classes listed are open to all persons except those restricted by age.
- 7. Members of the Committee shall be entitled to enter, subject to the same Rules.
- 8. Entrance fee shall be 50p per entry for Horticulture, Homecraft & Photography classes...Classes 73-99 are free.
- 9. All exhibits are to be grown by, made by and be the sole property of the exhibitor.
- 10. Tent classes. Any objections to exhibits must be lodged with the Secretary by 3.30 p.m. Such objections will be dealt with by a Special Committee whose decision will be final. A deposit of £5.00 to be paid by objector, to be refunded if the objection is sustained.
- 11. Gymkhana. Objections to or by any Competitor be made to the Secretary within 15 minutes of the event with a Deposit of £5.00. Forfeited if Objection is over-ruled.
- 12. No refund will be given to anybody withdrawing from classes.
- 13. The Committee will not be responsible for any Accident, Theft, or Damage that may happen to Competitors, Spectators, Horses, Attendants or Vehicles.
- 14. The Committee reserve the right to cancel, modify or alter any class or classes and Prize Money as they deem necessary.
- 15. All riders must wear a hard hat when mounted.
- 16. Any Horse/Pony competing as H.C. may not compete for Prize Money in subsequent classes.

Technical Challenge Orange and Chocolate Loaf

Set recipe: 175g butter softened,175g caster sugar,2 eggs, 175g SR flour,100g chocolate chips, zest and juice 1 orange,1 tbsp milk. Oven 180, Gas Mark 4

Method: Cream butter + sugar, bet in lightly beaten egg. Fold in flour, chocolate chips, orange zest and milk. Pour into greased, base lined loaf tin and bake approx. 40-45 mins. Remove from oven and prick top and brush with the orange juice. Cool for 10 mins before turning out.
